



SAMPLE STUDENT PLACEMENT ACTIVITIES

Listed below are examples of the kinds of activities students have performed at their Community Service Learning placement sites. Student roles have related to research and policy, program planning, and direct hands-on service. **However, the range and type of student activities is always growing.**

COLLEGE OF BUSINESS

Marketing: Students work in teams to develop and produce **advertisements** for non-profit agencies.

COLLEGE OF BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCE

Economics: Students work as **tutors, tenant right advocates, and data analysts.**

Psychology: Students work as **mentors, health educators, community outreach workers, and classroom assistants.**

COLLEGE OF CREATIVE ARTS

Broadcast & Electronic Communication: Students develop **production proposals, AV scripts and produce television programs and/or public service announcements** for mass production.

Dance: Students serve as **dance teacher assistants, choreographers, producers, costume designers, and event organizers** in middle/high schools, private studios, dance companies, and service organizations.

Design and Industry: Students are trained in the latest Web development tools and then assist Bay Area non-profit groups in **research, design, creation and management of websites**; design and develop **graphic materials** both in print materials (**brochures, catalogs, and referral guides**) and electronic format (**resource guides, training or referral materials**). Additionally, students develop **special equipment, play structures, and safety devices.**

COLLEGE OF ETHNIC STUDIES

Asian American Studies: Students **mentor** youth through different non-profits. Students also **collect oral histories** of senior citizens at community centers.

Black Studies: Students work in public interest legal organizations and **prepare summaries of the arguments and counter-arguments** regarding a particular proposition. Students **perform case studies** of the unique developmental challenges facing Black children.

La Raza Studies: Students provide **computer training** in **word processing, graphics, e-mail** and the **World Wide Web**. Students **write reports, conduct research, participate in community events such as voter registration drives, citizenship fairs, and fundraisers,** and work as **labor and community organizers and educators.**

COLLEGE OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

Health Education: Students work as **tutors, mentors, writers, and food servers** in agencies dealing with the homeless. They also work with community health educators, teachers, school nurses and counselors to **evaluate youth related health** and **assist in the planning and development of health education materials and resources for target populations.**

Nursing: Students work with the functional elderly as **companions, community educators, cooks and food servers, tutors, legislative advocates and mentors.**

Social Work: Students **assist low-income parents enroll in college--especially at City College of SF--and help students establish strategies, skills and support systems** needed to succeed in school and avoid dependence on public assistance.

COLLEGE OF HUMANITIES

English: Students work as **freelance writers and community educators** on issues related to citizenship, language, and literacy. Also, students are paired with ethnic elders in senior centers throughout the Bay Area to **collect oral histories, help with chores, tutor, research and write for the production of projects.**

Technical & Professional Writing: Students work with non-profit agencies **to identify appropriate funding sources, research, and prepare grants.**

Women's Studies: Students work with community agencies focusing **on women's issues** and perform various tasks.

COLLEGE OF SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

Biology: Students volunteer in **ecological restoration** projects.

Computer Science: Students **assess and train agency personnel in the use of tools for Internet communication, computer conferencing, electronic mail, file transfers, and World Wide Web applications.**
