

## **SFSU NAGPRA Program Research and Confidentiality Agreement**

The SFSU NAGPRA Program will consider limited term research projects conducted on archaeological collections and documents housed at SFSU. Submission of a request may be declined due to circumstances relating to the issues listed below.

1. Researcher must submit a detailed research proposal to SFSU NAGPRA Coordinator. Research design must be accompanied by curriculum vitae.
2. Research proposal will be reviewed by SFSU NAGPRA Coordinator and the Associate Vice-President for Academic Affairs.
3. For collections containing Native American human remains, funeral objects, or objects of cultural patrimony, it is the policy of the SFSU NAGPRA Program that culturally affiliated tribes will be consulted prior to any research project. Standard assignment of tribal affiliation by the Bureau of Indian Affairs or State of California Native American Heritage Council will be accepted as proof of tribal affiliation. Other criteria of tribal affiliation such as federal recognition status, historic and geographic affiliation will also be considered.
4. A letter showing tribal consent for the research project must be submitted by a culturally-affiliated tribe or individuals to the NAGPRA Program.

### **Confidentiality Agreement**

The SFSU NAGPRA Program maintains Native American archaeological collections with the utmost respect for tribal history. All researchers are expected to exhibit respect and discretion with Program information. No public disclosure of information on file at the SFSU NAGPRA Program will be made by researchers without review and approval of the disclosure of the information by the SFSU NAGPRA Program. No specific information concerning tribal histories, cultural sites, and personal interviews with tribal members will be allowed without the express permission of the culturally affiliated tribal consultants.

No public disclosure of particulars concerning the collections documentation will be made following the Archaeological Resource Protection Act (ARPA).

It is acknowledged that the public has a right to solicit access to public information. Public documents such as NAGPRA Notices of Inventory Completion and published reports will be made available to the public upon request.
