You also say that the new program has more flexibility... I see no flexibility, the students have 10 core classes for their 30 units, and that is it? I understand the idea of keeping all the classes with the gero faculty, but none of you teach anything to do with the physical aging process, which is what I think the panel was trying to make sure your students had some exposure to. With that said, do the guidelines for your societies (which you refer to as the groundwork for the changes, address the lack in this basic info being "OK" for students pursuing a Masters Degree?
