Montreal, the second largest French-speaking city in the world is located on an island in the heart of the St. Lawrence Valley. It dates back to the 17th century and is built around a mountain in the center of the island known as *Mont-Royal*. The city is within an hour's drive of a myriad of lakes and ski resorts in the Laurentian mountains and the Eastern Townships.

Few cities are as exciting and multi-dimensional as Montreal. As one of the great cities of the world, it boasts an Olympic stadium, a famous hockey team, a National League baseball team, world class art galleries, an excellent metro system and some of the finest shops this side of the Atlantic. Montreal is a major financial, business, and industrial center of higher learning and an attractive city for major research oriented companies. Montreal is, for example, the center of the Canadian aerospace industry.

The University has two campuses: the Sir George Williams Campus in the heart of the city, and the Loyola Campus near Montreal West.

Academic Program

Concordia University is one of the largest universities in Canada. With its 25,000 students it has only slightly fewer students than SFSU.

Concordia's Faculty of Commerce and Administration offers unique opportunities for business students. The 6,000 students in Concordia's FCA make it Canada's largest business school and of the most prestigious.
