Eligibility Requirements



Be an enrolled SFSU degree seeking student, or community college student eligible to enter SFSU and begin studies by program start date. Students must have declared a Hospitality Management major.



Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0. Lower GPA will be considered.



Have upper division or graduate standing by the end of term prior to departure.



Preference is given to students with one or more semesters Chinese language study and a minimum of one course in Chinese history/culture/politics/civilization.



Students who are considered Chinese nationals (including holders of passports from Hong Kong, Macau, Republic of China, and PRC) are not eligible.
