Århus, Denmark

Århus is the second largest city in Denmark. Founded by the Vikings in the year 1000, the city began to expand in 1900 because of industrialization. Greater Århus now has a population of half a million people, and the city's population is increasing steadily every year. The Århus School of Business is one of several universities in Århus, so there is a high proportion of young people in the area.

The city of Århus places great importance on preserving and protecting the environment. Public transportation and bikes are a high priority, and green parks fill the city. Conserving energy and recycling are also emphasized.

Århus is the center of business and cultural life in Jutland. The food industry has a solid base in Århus, with a focus on food processing and the production of foodstuff machinery. The graphic arts and iron-metal industries are also important components of the economy. Companies in Århus give priority to using high-tech equipment and the latest production methods.

Århus is an excellent connection point to both the rest of Scandinavia and other parts of Europe. Århus is approximately four hours from Copenhagen by car and ferry.

The Århus School of Business

The Århus school of Business was founded in 1939 and has had university status since 1956. Its focus, as the name implies, is on business administration and economics, as well as modern languages. The sixteen departments of the school include: Management Science, Organization and Management, Business Law, Information Science, International Business, Marketing, Economics, Applied Economics, Finance, Accounting, Auditing, four department of Modern Languages (English, German, French, Spanish), and Business Practices (such as shorthand and word processing). The language departments emphasize the commercial, technical, and legal applications of languages. A large number of the other courses are taught in English.

The Århus School of Business has recently expanded. New classroom and office buildings have been added to the school. The Århus School of Business is the second largest business school in Denmark, with a total student population of over six thousand. Both research and teaching have a strong international emphasis.
