The University

Chung-Ang University is a private, non-profit, non-denominational, coeducation institution. It currently enrolls more than 25,000 students in 84 different departments of the undergraduate and graduate programs. Chung-Ang University offers bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees. All of its degree programs are accredited by the Ministry of Education of Korea. Founded in 1918, the university comprises 16 colleges established at two campuses in Seoul and Anseong, a graduate school and 8 professional graduate schools, two university hospitals, and eight attached demonstration schools.

Although started as a women's college, Chung-Ang University became the first college in Korea to go co-educational in 1948. Chung-Ang University is now being placed among the best universities, full of dreams and hopes, thanks to its alumni, faculty members, and students.

Location

The Seoul Campus is located in the heart of Seoul by the Han River Bridge near the National Cemetery, on the southern side of the Han River. It is easily accessible by city bus lines or by subway trains. Two subway lines at Noryangjin Station and Sangdo Station are linked with CAU by local shuttle buses,

which takes you to downtown area in about 30 minutes.

The Anseong Campus is situated on the outskirts of Anseong City, Gyeonggi-do Province, which is one and a half hour ride from Seoul Campus. University shuttle buses run four times a day from Seoul Campus to Anseong Campus in the morning, and from Anseong Campus to Seoul Campus in the afternoon. In addition, intercity buses between Seoul and Anseong are available at ten minute intervals.

Eligibility Requirements



Be an enrolled SFSU degree seeking student, or community college student eligible to enter SFSU and begin studies by program start date.



Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.75.



Have upper division or graduate standing by the end of term prior to departure.



Have the ability to undertake university studies in the Korean language.
