ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Since the International Summer School (ISS) program was first established at the University of Seoul (UOS) in 2000, it has provided international students with the opportunity to learn about Korean culture and traditions. Reorganized in 2005, the ISS has received an increased amount of funding from the Seoul Metropolitan Government and now offers various incentives to participants coming from UOS' sister universities and other prestigious international universities. One of the unique advantages of the ISS is the one-on-one Buddy Program. UOS students share a room with each of the international students, helping him/her learn about Korea. This provides a valuable opportunity to form solid friendships.

The courses range from Korean Language to International Studies as well as Korean and Asian Studies. Students are required to take two three-credit in-class courses delivered in English and one two-credit course which consists of various field trips. Students should first consult their universities if they want to transfer the credits earned in the ISS to their home universities. In addition, students will take part in many extracurricular activities to experience Korean culture and society out of class.
