East Anglia, England

UEA is located just outside the historic, medieval city of Norwich— voted the best place to live in England for quality of life and prosperity.

Norwich is one of England's major provincial cities situated just 120 miles to the north-east of London and 60 miles from the beautiful university city of Cambridge. Just outside Norwich are the Norfolk Broads—miles of lakeland used for sailing and cruising. Norwich is half an hour away from the long Norfolk coastline, a mixture of wildlife sanctuaries, holiday beaches and fishing villages. Norwich is also a good base from which to travel abroad. It has its own airport with worldwide connections available through Amsterdam, and the nearby ports of Felixstowe and Harwich have ferry services to continental Europe.

Norwich is a fine city with an interesting blend of old and new traditions and architecture. The well preserved Norman cathedral and castle are both in daily use, the latter as a museum and art gallery. There are quaint medieval streets and churches, elegant eighteenth century houses and functional nineteenth and twentieth century buildings.

There is no shortage of places for entertainment and relaxation—cinemas, theatres, concert halls, museums, night clubs, pubs and restaurants to satisfy all tastes.

Academic Program

The University of East Anglia in Norwich, England has a reputation as one of the top places to study the Humanities in England. Combined with its excellence in the fields of Creative Writing, Film Studies, and the Performing Arts, this has made it a popular location for US students looking to study at a British University. Students have the opportunity to take courses fully integrated with British students in a wide variety of related fields.

Typical enrollment is three courses per semester with the option to also include courses taught in other Schools e.g. Art History, Politics, International Relations, etc. The School of English and American Studies has two research centres—the Arthur Miller Centre for American Studies and the Centre for Creative and Performing Arts. These centres bring students into regular contact with readings and lectures by distinguished writers and scholars.

Eligibility Requirements



Be an enrolled SFSU degree seeking student, or community college student eligible to enter SFSU and begin studies by program start date.



Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.00.



Have upper division or graduate standing by the end of term prior to departure.



Have the appropriate prerequisite coursework. Priority is given to students with a declared major in BECA, Cinema or Creative Writing.

Course Offerings Features

Creative Writing

Now established for over twenty five years, this program has long held a reputation for excellence at the graduate and undergraduate level. Undergraduate seminars introduce students to the demands and challenges of creative writing in a variety of different literary genres including prose fiction, drama, and poetry. Classes are designed to help students build technical and expressive skills: initiating ideas, developing formal strategy, creating character, determining and maintaining setting and mood and constructing dialog.

English Literature

This program offers students a way to explore English Culture and Society through both literary and historical approaches. Students may select for a wide range of English Literature courses covering different genres, critical approaches and methods of writing. Courses are available in a diversity of areas including: Medieval Literature, Metaphysical Poetry, Shakespearean Drama, Romanticism, Modernism, and Post-war Writing as well as in gender studies, psychoanalytic theory, comparative literature, linguistics, media studies, and literary criticism.

American Studies

In an American Studies seminar at UEA you might encounter questions on *The Great Gatsby* and the American Dream, intertextuality or the politics of race. The old perimeters of the subject have fallen, and the American Studies programme at UEA is actively engaged in remaking the subject.
