Dating back to the 12th century, Universidad de Zaragoza is one of the oldest universities in the world, and hosts over 32,000 students. Officially founded as a university in 1542, Zaragoza has a reputation for turning out internationally recognized professors and Nobel Prize winners. Due to its prestige, Zaragoza attracts a large number of international students to its campuses each year, and has been a pioneer in teaching Spanish to international students.

One of three campuses located in Aragon, the Huesca campus hosts the health and sports sciences (UZ-FCSD), nursing, humanities and education, business, and engineering schools and colleges.

Huesca, Spain

Huesca, chief town of its province and the see of a bishop, lies on the slopes of a hill above the Río Isuela. A typical Pyrenean town, it is an important market center for the agricultural produce of the surrounding area. Huesca is a modern city filled with tradition and history. It is a city where you can live, without traffic jams, in a familiar and welcoming environment, with students and locals. You will have time to hang around the streets, sit in the terraces or try its famous confectionery. The region offers a wide variety of sporting opportunities including horse riding, mountaineering, paragliding and mountain cycling. The landscape is dotted with monasteries, churches and fortresses and everywhere you go you will find legends of The Holy Grail, St. George and the Bell of Huesca, evoking a magical feel to the region.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

Students who wish to enter this program are also eligible to apply for language assistance scholarships funded by the Aragonian government. If selected by Regional Government authorities students will work in primary, secondary or language schools, and will receive between 350 and 1050 Euros per month depending on the number of hours that the student works per month.

HOUSING:

International Students have the option of rooming in the UZ at Huesca campus's student halls or getting their own room for rent. Both Universities will assist exchange students in securing appropriate lodging. Each host institution will provide participating students appropriate visa documents, and lodging information and will offer an on-site orientation.
