Access path key*

- Accessible Route—This path generally conforms to accessibility standards.
- Areas that may be a travel hazard (where the slope exceeds the standard maximum ramp slope [8.3%], or the cross-slope is significant [exceeds 4%]).
- Ramp (5%–8.3%)—Complying ramp along the accessible route.
- Lighter shade indicates path continues underneath overhang.
- Partially Accessible Route—This path generally conforms to accessibility standards, but there may be excessive cross-slope (over 2%) or other irregularities in a portion of the path, often along the path edge. There is usually a 48" wide complying path along these routes, though it may not be a straight or direct line.

*Note: The map and information on pathways are limited by the scale. The accessible route should be clear to a person at a location, while the dashed line is intended to indicate where keener observation may be necessary to locate the accessible route. Pathways are generally asphalt and subject to weathering, erosion, uplifting, and other changes that may create navigational issues. SFSU is committed to maintaining the accessible route. THE C.A.R.E. PROGRAM

Recent surveys indicate that campus communities nationwide are becoming increasingly concerned over issues involving personal safety in the university environment. San Francisco State University shares this concern and accepts the responsibility to develop and implement programs designed to ensure that the students, faculty, and staff enjoy their years at SF State as free as possible from threats to their personal safety or well-being.

The San Francisco State **C**ampus **A**lliance for a **R**isk-free **E**nvironment (**C.A.R.E.**) is a student security team employed, trained, and supervised by the State University Police Department.

HOURS AVAILABLE

C.A.R.E. employees are available from 4:30pm to 11:00pm, Monday through Friday. SF State Police Officers will be available for escort service when **C.A.R.E.** members are not on duty. To arrange for your escort **CALL (415) 338-7200 then press 0** and tell the dispatcher where you would prefer to be met. Please allow 10 to 15 minutes for **C.A.R.E.** to arrive.

SCREENING

Students employed for **C.A.R.E.** are accepted only after successful fingerprint screening and a thorough background check.

TRAINING

All new **C.A.R.E.** employees are required to attend general Crime Prevention training modules presented by The University Police as well as Defensive Driving training. DPRC also provides training to all **C.A.R.E.** employees.

SUPERVISION

C.A.R.E. employees work under the direct supervision of the on-duty Patrol Sergeant or Watch Commander of The University Police Department.

IDENTIFICATION

While on duty, each **C.A.R.E.** member will be wearing a red polo shirt with the San Francisco State University Police Department in white on the front. Employees may also wear a red jacket with **C.A.R.E.** written in large white letters. All employees will be equipped with a two-way radio for direct contact with The University Police Dispatch Center and will carry flashlights for lighting assistance where required.

SERVICES PROVIDED

C.A.R.E. employees primary responsibility will be to provide personal escorts and additional building security during evening and night time hours.

C.A.R.E. employees will be available to escort you to and from your car, classroom, laboratory, office, UPN, UPS, Park Merced or to your campus apartment. Escorts will also walk you to off campus, nearby, destinations. Escort carts may not be taken off campus.

NIGHT TIME TRANSPORTATION

Night time on-campus transportation is available to all students with temporary or permanent disabilities. This service is available Monday through Friday, 4:30 pm to 11:00 pm. Cart rides may be scheduled in advance or requested by telephone as needed.

APPOINTMENTS

Advanced appointments for each semester can be made with the Parking and Transportation staff, by calling the Parking and Transportation Office at (415) 338-1441, during the hours of 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. They can also be made on the website at <http://www.sfsu.edu/~parking> or by fax at (415) 338-0529. Advanced appointments cannot be set up during the evening hours.

WITHOUT AN APPOINTMENT

To request a cart ride during the evening just call (415) 338-7200 from your mobile phone, or 87200 from any campus phone, and press 0 to reach a dispatcher. There are yellow courtesy phones available throughout campus. An Escort will arrive within 10 to 15 minutes and give cart rides to anywhere on-campus.

People with disabilities who require an escort during the day can call DPRC at (415) 338-2472.
