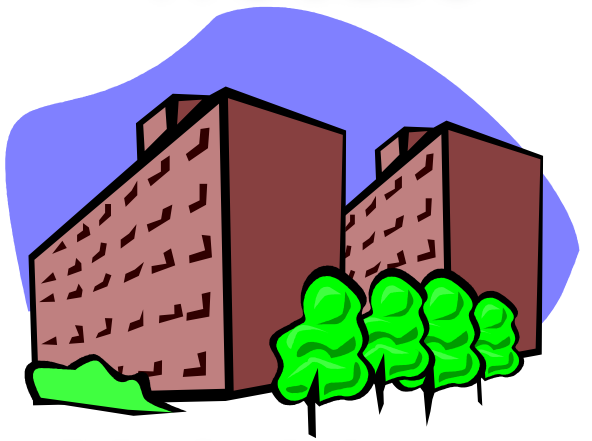
## Access path key\*

- Accessible Route—This path generally conforms to accessibility standards.
- Areas that may be a travel hazard (where the slope exceeds the standard maximum ramp slope [8.3%], or the cross-slope is significant [exceeds 4%]).
- Ramp (5%–8.3%)—Complying ramp along the accessible route.
- Partially Accessible Route—This path generally conforms to accessibility standards, but there may be excessive cross-slope (over 2%) or other irregularities in a portion of the path, often along the path edge. There is usually a 48" wide complying path along these routes, though it may not be a straight or direct line.
- Lighter shade indicates path continues underneath overhang.

\*Note: The map and information on pathways are limited by the scale. The accessible route should be clear to a person at a location, while the dashed line is intended to indicate where better observation may be necessary to locate the accessible route. Pathways are generally asphalt and subject to weathering, erosion, shifting, and other changes that may create navigational issues. SFSU is committed to maintaining the accessible route. Greetings neighbor:

As a resident in the area of San Francisco State University, we are pleased to consider you part of the University community and our neighbor. As a member of the University community, we would like to take this opportunity to inform you of the services the University Police provides. You do not need to be a student to call the University Police for service.



San Francisco State University is fortunate to be located in one of the most pleasant areas of the city, far enough away from downtown, to avoid many of the crime problems that occur there. This is not to say that crime does not occur in our area, as it does. However, we tend to have more property related offenses as opposed to violent crimes. Property crimes are mainly crimes of opportunity, which we can help to reduce.

The San Francisco State University Police Department is comprised of State Peace Officers with authority under state law to act and enforce all laws within a one mile radius from the University, the exception being when in pursuit or when investigating campus related crimes. In such instances police powers extend statewide. What this means is that the University Police is in your neighborhood attempting to suppress crime and maintain a safe campus community.

You can best help the University Police by reporting the following types of activities:

- Anyone tampering with an automobile or peering into cars.
- A stranger loitering about your neighborhood.
- Anyone hiding in bushes or other shrubbery.
- Someone testing doors as they walk down the street.
- A person screaming or calling for help.
- The sound of breaking glass.
- A person carrying property out of a house, especially at an unusual hour.
- A traffic accident.
- A loud explosion or gunshots.

Do not attempt to explain or rationalize unusual circumstances or behavior. When in doubt, always call the University Police to report the incident. University Police officers are on duty 24 hours a day, every day of the year to serve you! Your assistance is appreciated.
